

**Mast Bury, Point "B"**

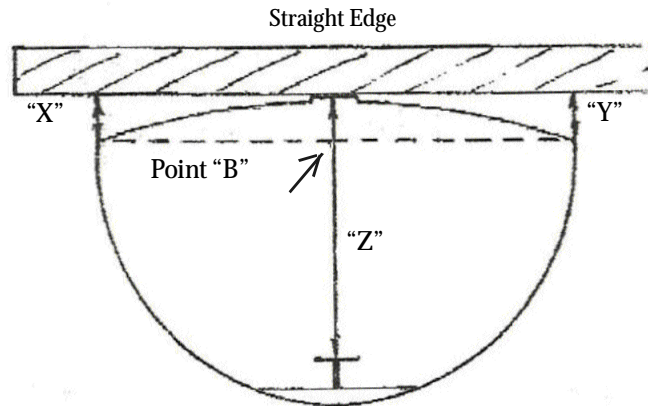
Class Members often ask how they can find the Mast Bury, Point "B" on their boat. If your boat has been issued a Hull Certificate, then Point "B" has already been established and is Item 31 on the detailed Measurement Form filed with the authority that issued the certificate. In the future it should appear on all new Hull Certificates.

Below is the method Class Chief Measurer Denis Heywood has established to measure Point "B".

Loosen the shrouds. Set up a straight edge at the center of the mast port, square to the centerline of the boat. Measure down to the actual edge of the deck/hull edge on both sides to find "X" and "Y". Average those measurements and note as "A".

Measure down through the mast port to top of the actual mast step. This is "Z". Subtract previous measurement "A" from "Z"

This is the Mast Bury, Point "B".



$$\frac{"X" + "Y"}{2} = "A"$$

$$"Z" - "A" = "B"$$
